

### Speak Today - Shape Tomorrow!

Have you ever wished you could tell your leaders what you think? This fall all AF personnel will have the opportunity to Speak Today, Shape Tomorrow. The 2010 Air Force Climate Survey launched October 1st, 2010 and your leaders want to hear from you! The purpose of the survey is to assess the opinions and perceptions of Air Force Active Duty, Guard, Reserve, and Civilian personnel on a wide range of issues, including "Satisfaction", "Resources", and "Unit Performance". As in past surveys, unit leaders will receive their units' results to improve their organization and their organization's ability to accomplish the mission. Your input is a very important part of the process.

Your leaders need honest feedback from the Air Force's most valuable resource - YOU.

Since 1999, the Air Force Climate Survey has been evolving with the goal of minimizing the length of time required to complete the survey, while optimizing the amount of information collected. The online survey system has been enhanced with a more robust architecture so survey respondents will experience less page transition time. There are comment questions to provide an avenue for you to openly express your opinions.

Individual e-mail invitations for the survey will be sent out in stages beginning 1 Oct through 8 Oct 2010. Aggregated reports by PAS code will be sent to commanders whose units have a sufficient number of respondents. More technical upgrades to the Air Force Survey System will allow commanders to access their reports even sooner than in previous years, enabling them to promptly take action for improvements. Your feedback will also directly impact leaders' decisions on issues that affect the Total Force.

**"Smoke Alarms: A Sound You Can Live With!"** is NFPA's official theme for Fire Prevention Week (FPW), October 3rd-9th. If you're wondering why NFPA, the official sponsor of FPW for nearly 90 years, is focusing on smoke alarms even though most homes already have at least one, you've come to the right place!

This year's campaign is designed to educate people about the importance of smoke alarms and it encourages everyone to take the necessary steps to update and maintain the smoke alarm protection in their homes.

*Fire Prevention is the number one way to protect lives and property*. In 2008, Fire Departments responded to over 1,451,500 fires and of these, 403,000 were residential fires. In this same year, 83 percent of the civilian fire deaths occurred in the home. Sadly these National Statistics are among the highest in the world. DOD's Fire Incident and Death rates (per million personnel) are less than one-half the National rates, but they can still be improved. Improvement requires that we remind ourselves periodically of the dangers of fire and some of the simple measures that can be taken to minimize loss of life. Take this opportunity, not only in the work place but in your homes as well, to set up and practice good fire prevention. If you have not already made an escape plan, take this time to do so and then practice it with your families. Check and test your smoke detectors. Smoke detectors do and can save lives. A good practice to get in to, is to change your batteries every time the time changes.

Please let's all work to be more fire safe. If anyone has any questions about fire safety, either in the home or at the work place, Charles Loveday, Base Fire Inspector, can be reached Monday-Friday 08:00-16:30 or on drill weekends at Ext. 3319 or by email.

## COMMAND CHIEF MASTER SGT. VACANCY

There will soon be a vacancy for the position of Command Chief Master Sergeant for the 134th ARW. Applications are now being accepted for assignment to this duty. Follow the instructions in the "How to Apply" section below if you are interested in submitting an application. You must meet the minimum qualifications.

#### Minimum Qualifications

-Currently be serving in the grade of Chief Master Sgt. with the eligibility to complete minimum three year assignment

-Must be highly motivated and capable of fulfilling the role of CCM as prescribed in ANGI 36-2109

- -Have strong leadership and managerial skills
- -Meet Fitness Standards and project the proper military image
- -Computer Skills required
- -Assignment length is normally 3-4 years or at the discretion of the Wing CC
- -Possess good communication skills

-Possess the ability to establish a close rapport with the following groups:



commanders, senior officers, chiefs, first sergeants, unit career advisors, managers of offices responsible for recruiting, retention, training, education, family readiness, and Employer Support of Guard and Reserve (ESGR). Establish effective communications by: unit visits, phone calls, attending commander calls, joining deployments, being involved in official functions (unit retirements, promotions and awards ceremonies), and attending special events and social functions.

-It is essential the Command Chief Master Sergeant be available and very flexible in order to attend required conferences around the country as well as selection boards both at the wing and state headquarters. This also includes support of TEC graduations and special functions.

### How to Apply

Prepare the following documents:

- AF Form 1206, Nomination for Award. (Use this form to document your individual qualifications)

- -Current RIP
- -Submit copy of most recent Fitness Test
- -Letters of Recommendation from current Unit Commander or others

Submit your application to 134FSS/DPM, Chief Master Sergeant Linda Gibson no Later than 3 December, 2010. Qualified applicants will be contacted as to the time and place of the Selection Board. Candidates must wear the service dress uniform to meet the selection board.

### **COMMUNICATIONS SECURITY**

### INFOCON

Information Operation Conditions (INFOCONs) are an operational response set prescribed by the Department of Defense (DoD) to react to increased threats of information attacks against information resources and networks. The 134 ARW takes

INFOCON direction from ANG NOSC.

Since INFOCONs are relatively new, care should be taken to ensure it is not confused with other alert conditions such as Force Protection Conditions (FPCONs) and Defense Conditions (DEFCONs). INFOCON is essentially employing those protection requirements for our automated information systems, and particularly those that are networked.

There are currently four elevations of INFOCON above INFOCON 5 (normal); they are 4 (increased risk of attack), 3 (specific risk of attack), 2 (limited attack), and 1 (general attack).

When the Network Control Center (NCC) receives an INFOCON change message, they will immediately notify the Wing Information Assurance Officer (WIAO). Together, the NCC and the WIAO are responsible for completion of all actions; however, individual users must comply with each INFOCON and respond to increased INFOCON levels as directed by the NCC. The NCC notifies work center personnel of INFOCON changes via scripts, Reach Plus, email, telephone, or runner. It is very important that each person knows what to do for each INFOCON. The required actions for each of these conditions are available on the X drive at: file://X:\CF\ SCXS\41-Word Processing Files\QRC.

### Student Flight – Listen Up!

\*\*\*Roll Call – Sunday at 1215 you will report to the Headquarters building. Sunday morning you will report to your unit for roll call. You must report to roll call in order to get paid.

\*\*\***Pre-BMT class** – **Sunday** of each drill at **1220**. This is a **mandatory** class **(as directed by Col. Dearing)** until you ship out to BMT. Any absence must be cleared through the recruiting office supervisor, Master Sgt. Bart Welch, ahead of time.

\*\*\*In Processing Checklist - Saturday at 1300 of your first drill weekend you are required to report to the photo lab (in the headquarters building) to have your **portrait** taken. This is <u>mandatory</u> in order to complete your in processing checklist.

\*\*\*Security Clearance Process – All new enlistees please ensure you have logged onto <u>www.</u> <u>opm.gov/e-gip</u>, to initiate your clearance. Once you have logged on, you have 60 DAYS to complete this. This is a mandatory item. Failure to complete on time will result in a counseling session with the Force Support Squadron Commander, Maj. Robin Celatka. Note: answer 'unknown' the first time and only the first time you answer the question 'place of birth.'
