McGhee Tyson ANGB Mass Notification System

Over the past several months, you may have noticed an increase in announcements, computer “pop-ups” and text messages and automated phone calls from the base. The Air Force requires every base to have a Mass Notification System (MNS) as directed by AFI 10-2501 and AFI 10-206. MNS is a powerful tool that can be used by the Command Post, Security Forces, or Emergency Management personnel to deliver the right information to the right people at the right time. McGhee Tyson ANGB has three

components of our MNS that can be used together or independently: Overhead Paging System, Giant Voice, and AtHoc.

1) Overhead Paging System (OHPS) – also known as the “Public Address (PA)”

2) Giant Voice - The purpose of the Giant Voice system is to allow Command Post controllers (or others as designated) to provide immediate notification to the entire base population with information for emergencies such as severe weather, natural disaster warnings or other emergency situations where information needs to be quickly distributed to base personnel. Giant Voice uses all the components of the OHPS, but it transmits on all of them at the same time. An example emergency message would be one for those on the Flight-line with approaching adverse weather. Airmen may hear a pre-recorded or live message saying, "Lightning warning! Immediately clear the area and return to your work sections". In addition to emergency warnings, other features of the giant voice system allow the airing of: flag conditions, mission oriented protective posture levels, alarm conditions, force protection changes, active shooter announcements, etc. Other locally determined information may be broadcast at the base commander's discretion.

3) Distributed Recipient Mass Notification System (DRMNS) – this system is employed through a web-based application known as AtHoc. It is used to distribute important information to personnel who may not be in the local area via texting, email, and phone calls. It can also send messages to all networked computers in a local area. Only certain users have administrator rights to send these messages (i.e. Command Post, SFS, and other designated personnel).

International Holocaust Remembrance Day, April 24th, 2018

In 1933, nine million Jews lived in the countries of Europe that would be occupied by Nazi Germany during the war. The Holocaust was the systematic persecution and murder of approximately six million Jews by the Nazi regime and its collaborators. The Nazis also targeted:

Roma/Sinti or Gypsies, Black people, those with mental and physical disabilities, and Slavic people including Poles and Russians. Other groups were persecuted on political, ideological, and behavioral grounds, among them Communists, Socialists, Jehovah's Witnesses, and homosexuals. Holocaust is a word of Greek origin meaning "sacrifice by fire." Nazis believed they were "racially superior" and that Jews and others were a threat to the German community. By 1945, six million Jews were murdered during the Nazi genocide. This included two million children under the age of 15. In all, 11 million people from these groups were persecuted. Every generation must learn and apply the lessons of the Holocaust to prevent new horrors against humanity from occurring. On International Holocaust Remembrance Day, we acknowledge this dark stain on human history and vow to never let it happen again.

Airmen Need to Certify Records in SGLI Online Enrollment System (SOES)

BUCKLEY AIR FORCE BASE, Colo. - In August 2017 the Air Force began a 12-month notification process, by birth month, and roll-out of the SGLI (Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance) Online Enrollment System (SOES).



Currently the Air Force stands at a 57.36 percent certification completion rate for members whose birthdays fall between Aug. 2, 2017 and Feb. 28, 2018. This number should be at least 95 percent. Also important to note is that members do not, and should not, wait till their birth month to accomplish this.

A key component to the implementation of SOES is the servicemember's certification of his/her SOES record. The initial DMDC data upload creating the record is not considered authoritative until the member reviews and/or updates the coverage elections, beneficiaries, and allocations of shares and certifies the record with an electronic signature.

SOES allows Airmen with full-time SGLI coverage to make online changes to their life insurance coverage and beneficiary information at any time without having to

complete a paper form.

SGLI provides automatic life insurance coverage of \$400,000 to servicemembers upon enlistment, commissioning, or activation to active duty (ARC members on orders for 31 consecutive days or more, or in support of a contingency operation).

Members with SGLI also get automatic coverage for their dependent children and non-military spouses under the Family Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance (FSGLI) program. FSGLI coverage is not automatic for military-to-military marriages on or after Jan. 2, 2013. Those servicemembers must elect FSGLI coverage for their spouse in SOES. Servicemembers can use SOES to manage the amount of their SGLI and spouse coverage (FSGLI) and to name and update beneficiaries.

SOES can be accessed by logging onto www.dmdc.osd.mil/milconnect, signing in, then clicking on "SOES" under the "Benefits" tab. Airmen are encouraged to log in with their CAC or DS Logon as soon as they receive their myPers Birthday Message, if deploying, or a life changing event occurs (e.g. marriage, divorce) to ensure their SGLI/FSGLI coverage and beneficiaries are up-to-date.

If you still need assistance please contact your unit CSS or visit the MPF for guidance on completing the SOES enrollment.

1. Sign in to milConnect at <https://www.dmdc.osd.mil/milconnect/>
2. In the top right corner, select "Sign In"
3. Select the middle option to log in with your CAC
4. In the top black banner of the home page, go to "Benefits" and select "Life Insurance (SOES- SGLI Enrollment System)"
5. Scroll to the bottom of the page and select "Continue"
6. Select "Yes" or "No" for if the spouse information is correct
7. The next page will show your current coverage
- NOTE: BEFORE you confirm and certify, ensure the amount is correct; if incorrect, go to "Edit Coverage". Ensure that your beneficiaries transferred over by selecting "Edit Beneficiaries"; if they did not, add who you would like and the percentage you would like them to receive.
8. Once you have completed the above steps, select "Confirm & Certify"
9. Check all boxes and select "continue"
10. The next window will pop up a preview of your coverage. ***Ensure you review it for accuracy, then select "Continue"
11. Provide your electronic signature and continue
12. Print/save a copy

Prior Enlisted personnel, Commissioned Officer in the grade of Major or below (Active or Reserve) or non-prior service civilian may apply if qualified for commission as follows:

- **NON-COMMISSIONED APPLICANT AGE:** Due to the length of administrative processing involved in the commissioning process, applicants **must** be selected by age **28** and be no more than age **30** by the start date of the board's first available **Undergraduate Pilot Training Class (UPT)**. This will allow time for **non-prior commissioned** applicants to graduate from the Academy of Military Science as an ANG officer prior to attending UPT. **Prior-Commissioned Applicant** must have not exceeded rank-age ceiling. Call MSgt Sawyer at 865-336-3242/DSN266-3242 for eligibility clarification.
- **MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS:** Applicants **must** pass a Flying Class 1 physical (Appointment ANG/AF Commissioning physical).
- **AIR FORCE OFFICER QUALIFYING TEST (AFOQT):** Applicants **must** have taken the AFOQT and qualify with a minimum score of **Verbal-15; Quantitative-10; Pilot 25; Navigator 10; Sum-50 (Sum is the minimum composite score required by adding both the scores of Pilot and Navigator.)** Applicants must meet or exceed the minimum Pilot and/or Navigator scores to qualify for appointment and attendance of Undergraduate Pilot Training (UPT).
- **EDUCATION:** Applicants **require** as a minimum a Bachelor's Degree from an educational institute listed in the current Accredited Institutions of Post Secondary Education. For entry into this specialty, undergraduate degree specializing in physical sciences, mathematics, administration, or management is desired. **Applicant must have attained the degree prior to the UPT Class start date.**
- **SPECIALTY QUALIFICATIONS:** Knowledge is mandatory of theory of flight, air navigation, meteorology, flying directives, aircraft operating procedures, and mission tactics. For entry into this specialty, completion of Air Force Undergraduate Pilot Training (UPT).
- **PILOT CANDIDATE SELECTION METHOD (PCSM):** Must complete Test of Basic Aviation Skills (TBAS) to obtain score. **PCSM Score of 10 or higher is required.** PCSM information website: <https://pcsm.aetc.af.mil/>.
- **LETTER OF AGREEMENT:** Applicants **must** submit a letter of agreement to attend within one year (pending availability of school quotas) of commissioning (or assignment if prior commissioned officer) any initial formal training as listed in the Training Requirements section. **Applications are considered incomplete without this letter (see attachment 1).**
- **COMMISSION REINSTATEMENT:** Prior commissioned officers must be eligible to reinstate commission and retrain. Cross-component service officers will not be required to attend the Academy of Military Science.
